How Good Are Our Combined Hands?

Thinking About A Slam When Partner Has a Strong Balanced Hand

- It is natural to think about slam when partner opens 1 no trump and you have a strong hand.
- Don't get ahead of yourself. Your first task is to determine if you have a fit and then how strong a fit.
- A 6-3 fit is considerably stronger than a 6-2 or 5-3 fit, when considering slam prospects.

Jacoby Transfer vs. Texas Transfer

The Texas transfer is done at the 4 level.

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Opener..... Responder

1nt 4 ◆
4 ♥ pass
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- The same idea applies for hearts transfer to spades.
- You use the Texas transfer when you want to be in game with no desire to go further.

Using the Jacoby Transfer to Communicate Slam Interest

The Jacoby transfer is done at the 2 level.

Opener..... Responder

1nt 2 ◆

2 ♥ 4 **♥**

- Consider the logic of this bid. Responder is saying, "If I was only interested in game I would have used Texas Transfer."
- What do you think about slam... particularly, how good a fit do we have?

Responder's Hand

- **★** A 5 2

Responder communicates, "I'm not sure about a slam, but I have a pretty good hand.

Responder would hope opener would consider slam with Hand 1 or 2, but reject slam with hand 3.

A 6-Card Suit With Shortness

- When you have a 6-card suit and a singleton, you might need fewer high-card points.
- Nevertheless, you need a good bit more than a minimum hand to have slam interest.
- Using Jacoby transfer followed by a jump to the 4-level, shows a 6-card suit with shortness and slam interest.

Opener revalues his hand for slam possibilities. Hand 6, looks good. Hand 7 is less attractive.

Suppose Partner Opens 2 NT

- Partner has a much stronger hand, 20-21 points. You need less to have slam interest.
- When you have a 6-card suit, you know that there is a fit.
- You can work with the difference between the Texas and Jacoby transfer systems.
- You can transfer and bid a new suit at the four level to show slam interest with shortness.

Partner Opens 2 nt

- When you have a 5-card major and values to suggest you are in the slam range, if your hand is relatively balanced, you might forget the 5-card suit and go for a no trump game.
- If it is appropriate, you have Gerber available and the quantitative 4 no trump.

Partner Opens a1-Level Suit Bid

- Your first task is to find a fit or be sure the hand will play in no trump.
- You cannot have slam interest until you know what the final contract will be in (suit or no trump).
- Once you are clear where the hand will play, you can evaluate your hand for slam interest.
