The South hand has several options over North's 1 opening.. At Table 1, the splinter left North as captain and the 6 opening ended the auction. It actually works best on this hand if South does the asking. A splinter with a singleton King may be correct, but a Jacoby 2NT works well. What is your choice with the South hand and why?

Bid this hand with your partner and see how you would do.

Here is a summary of the Jacoby 2NT I play with most partners:
3♣ = minimum unbalanced
3♦ asks: SL, SM, SH [short low, middle, high]
3♦ = balanced, 15+

3♥ asks: 3♣ = 5422 [3NT asks for 4 card suit: LMH] 3NT = 5332; 4♣ = 6322 3♥ = SL (♣), 15+ 3♠ = SM (♠), 15+ 3NT = SH (other Major), 15+ 4♣/♠ = a good 5 card minor (or void if you choose) 4M = minimum balanced

North has just enough for a negative X. East has a good raise, so Q bids. Do you agree? If you don't approve of the actions so far?

West has a very good hand. Once East shows up with a ♥ stopper, it is unlikely that he also has stoppers in both ♦ and ▲. Would you pass 3NT? Why or why not? What should West bid if he decides to pull 3NT?

This ended up as an excellent contract for East/West. However, it is much more difficult if East does not show 2+Q. It is conceivable that the opponents can cash the Ace and King of \clubsuit . Do you agree? Would you bid 4NT with the West hand?

In the second auction, West is asking East for a \clubsuit control. East would pass with 2 losers, bid 6 \checkmark with 2nd round control and 5 \clubsuit with first.

How would you play it on a A lead?

This was not a good contract, but did make. The South hand is excellent opposite a \blacklozenge fit and not much wasted in \clubsuit . If North has most of his hand in \clubsuit , 3NT is probably best.

Many partnerships use a Polish invention that a jump to 3 of a minor shows shortness with 43 or 44 in the majors and game forcing or better strength. **Would you bid raise 3NT to 4NT with the South hand?**
