The Weak Two Bid In Competition

You Decide to Play Weak Twos

- You mark your card 5-11 hcps and talk about what you'll do if you have a good hand opposite partner's weak two.
- But what will you do when the opponents bid?
- You know, unless you have a pretty strong hand, the opponents will bid.
- We'll look as some situations.

Partner Opens a Weak Two, Your RHO Doubles

- Raises of partner's suit are the same as without the double.
- The question is, how high to raise?
- And is there a difference if partner bid hearts or spades?

Partner Opens 2 ♥, RHO Doubles

Hand 1

- **♦** A 4
- **♥** J 9 7
- ♦ 10 5 4
- ♣ Q J 9 4 3

With 6-12 points and 3-card support, raise one level.

Hand 2

- **♦** A 4
- ♥ J 9 7 5
- ♦ 10 5
- ♣ Q J 9 4 3

With 6-12 points and 4-card support, raise to the 4 level.

Partner Opens 2 ♠, RHO Doubles

Hand 3

- **★** KJ63
- **Q** 10 7 4
- ♦ Q 4
- ♣ J 9 4

- If you bid 4 ♠, the auction probably ends there.
- Partner is likely down one.
- If you bid 3 spades the opponents will probably bid 4 .
- There's no guarantee, but that bid might not make.

Partner Opens 2 ♥, RHO Doubles

Hand 4

- **♠** 6 3
- **Q** 10 7 5 4
- ♦ AJ 10 4
- ♣ J 9

- You can bid 4 ♥, but you know they will bid 4 ♠
- Best bid 5 virectly.
 Make them decide what to do.
- Especially true with favorable vulnerability, but likely good with even vulnerability.

Partner Opens 2 ♠, RHO Doubles

Hand 5

- ◆ 9 7 6 3
- **7** 5
- ♦ AJ 104
- **♣** J 9 5

- You can bid 4 ♠, but they will bid 5 ♥
- Partner is on lead.
- Partner's suit is
 - ★KJ10842
 - ♠AQJ842
- You might bid 4 ◆. In this situation it is, by agreement, lead directing.
- And guaranteeing support of the weaktwo suit at that level.

The Situation Might Look Like This

A change of direction, now. Let's look at the takeout doubler's partner.

When You Are the Partner of the Doubler

- A weak-two bid, partner makes a takeout double, RHO passes.
- This is often a difficult situation.
 - Partner has a good hand, of course.
 - RHO is unknown.
 - Might have a strong hand,
 - but no support for his partner's weak two suit.
- You are forced to bid, but you want to describe your hand to partner.

Here is a Lebensohl-like System for Describing Your Hand.

- With 0-7 points you will bid at the two level if possible.
- With 0-7 points and a two-level bid is not available:
 - Bid two no trump. (must be alerted)
 - Partner bids 3 ♣ (forced)
 - You will
 - Pass if clubs is your suit
 - Bid your suit, and partner will probably pass.

5 points. Bid 2 ♠.

2 ★ ...Double....Pass...??

- ↑ 7 5♥ Q 10 8 3♦ K J 9 3
- ♣ J 4 2

7 points. Bid 2 nt, partner will bid 3 ♣, you bid 3 ♥.

2 ★ ...Double....Pass...??

- **↑** 7 5 2
- **Y** 10 8 3
- ♦ Q 9 3
- ♣ Q J 4 2

5 points. Bid 2 nt, partner will bid 3 ♣, you will pass.

2 • ...Double....Pass...??

- **♠** Q 5 2
- **v** 10 8 3
- 9 3
- ♣ A 9 5 4 2

6 points. Bid 2 nt, partner will bid 3 ♣, you will pass.

2 • ...Double....Pass...??

- **♠** Q 5 2
- **v** 10 8 3
- ♦ 93
- ♣ AK542

9 points, bid 3 ♣.

A non-jump 3 level bid shows 9-11 points.

2 ★ ...Double....Pass...??

- **★** 52
- **Y** K 10 8 3
- 932
- ♣ AQ54

9 points, bid 3 ♥

A Non-jump 3- level bid shows 9-11 points.

2 \leftrightarrowDouble....Pass...??

This is the difficult one. Watch out for it!

- **♠** Q 8 5 2
- **v** 10 8 3
- 9 3
- ♠ AK54

9 points, bid 2 nt, partner bids 3 ♣, You bid 3 ♠

Going through the relay, then bidding a suit you could have bid at the two level; shows 9-11 points.

2 \leftrightarrowDouble....Pass...??

- **♦** AJ52
- **v** 10 8 3
- 93
- ♣ AK54

12 points, bid 3 ♠

Any jump bid over partner's double is game forcing, showing 12+ points.

2 V ...Double....Pass...??

- **♦** AJ5
- **Y** 10
- ♦ KQ10953
- ★ K 5 4

13 points, bid 4 ◆

Any jump bid over partner's double is game forcing, showing 12+ points.
