Bridge 19 - Intervening Bids

Background

What should you do if the opponents have already opening the bidding, and you have a hand:

- With at least "normal opening" points (ie with 12 13+ points), or
- With just less than "normal opening" points and with a good biddable suit (ie good 5+ card suit).

Consider making a bid (known as an intervening bid or an overcall) with the multiple objectives :

- a) To try and "steal" the contract away from the opposition, and or
- b) To remove "bidding space" from the opposition, thus making it more difficult (or even impossible) for them to find the correct contract, and or
- c) Even if the opposition manage to gain the contract, to signal to partner a suitable suit to lead.
- Intervening bids after an opening suit bid (see later for what to do with a stronger hand)

| Intervening hand points | Intervening hand "shape" | Intervening hand bid | Purpose or intent |
|----------------------------|------------------------------|--------------------------|---|
| 8 - 10 points | Good quality 5+ card suit | Bid suit at 1-level | To hope to gain a contract |
| 11 - 15 points | 5+ card suit | Bid suit at lowest level | To hope to gain a contract, and OK to bid at the 2-level if necessary |
| 11 - 15 points | Good quality 6+ card suit | Jump bid suit | To hope to gain a contract |

Intervening bids after an opening weak 1 No Trump bid (see later for what to do with a stronger hand)

| 6 - 9 points | 3+ card support | Raise 1 level in partners suit | |
| 10 - 15 points | 3+ card support | Jump raise in partners suit | |
| 16+ points | 3+ card support | Raise to game in partners suit | |
| 10 - 15 points | No 3+ card support, but with 5+ card suit | Bid own suit at lowest level | Such a bid is not considered as forcing |
| 16+ points | No 3+ card support, but with 5+ card suit | Jump bid own suit | This is forcing for one round |
| 9 - 12 points | Balanced, no 3+ card support, and a "stop" in opponents suit | Bid 1 No Trump | |
| 13 - 14 points | Balanced, no 3+ card support, and a "stop" in opponents suit | Bid 2 No Trumps | |
| 15+ points | Balanced, no 3+ card support, and a "stop" in opponents suit | Bid 3 No Trumps | |

Respond as if partner hand made a normal opening bid (but 1 bid higher than normal)
