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

What is an Overcall?

Review table "positions"



- Overcaller bids "over" the opener's bid ie, the "Overcaller"
- Partner of the Overcaller is called the "Advancer".

Overcall bids - made simple

- Definition: The bid made after the opponent "opens" the bidding process
- To bid as the Overcaller...
 - At the 1 level (Ex: Opponent bids 1 →, you bid 1 ♥)
 - 8 HCPs with most of the points being in the suit that you're bidding....and at least 5 cards in that suit!
 - At the 2 level (Ex: Opponents bids 1 ♠, you bid 2 ♥)
 - <u>10/11+ HCPs</u> with majority of the points being in the suit that you're bidding....and at <u>least 5 cards in that suit!</u>

The Simple Overcall

Important factors to think about when you are overcalling in a suit....

- What is my "trick taking" ability (more important than points)
- Would I be happy if my partner leads that suit to me in defense?

Consider these 2 hands. Your right hand opponent (RHO) opens 1 ♥

Hand A Hand B ♠ KQJ10x **♦** Jxxxx ♥ Qxx ♥ XXX Kxx A x x ♣ A 10 ♣ XX 11 total points 11 total points

What are the Advantages & Disadvantages of Overcalling?

Advantages

- To give Partner a signal for a good <u>opening lead</u>
- o To **obstruct** the Opponent's' bidding push them higher up on the bidding ladder
- To <u>compete</u> for a part score or, less likely, a game contract for your side.
 (Remember: Opponent has already opened and has between 13 to 21 points! How many points could your partner have if you have 8 to 16 total points? Pay special attention to the Responder's bid.)
- Can "scare" opponents into NOT bidding enough


Disadvantages

- You might be left in a contract that can be defeated
- Provides information to your opponents

Overcall examples:


Opponent on your RIGHT opens 1 ♥ in all of the following examples: What should you bid in the "Overcaller" position?

- 1. ♠ AQJ108
 - **7** 3
 - ♦ A95
 - **♣** 10 4 2
- Answer: 1 ♠
 - 2. ★ K842
 - **9** 873
 - **•** 5
 - ♣ AKQ106
- Answer: 2 ♣
 - 3. 103
 - **y** 3
 - ◆ AQJ73
 - ♣ AK942



Answer: 2 ♦

What is the role of the Advancer?



- Similar to the role of the "Responder" but at slightly higher hand values
- Remember....Overcaller could have as few as 8 points

Bidding guidelines for the Advancer

Less than 8 points	PASS
8 - 9 points	Raise one level with at least 3 of partner's suit
Cue bid	10+ points and support for partner's suit
No support of partner's suit but a good suit of your own	Bid your suit (10+ pts)
With control in Opponents suit	Consider No Trump (10+ pts)

What's a Cue Bid? How do you bid a Cue bid?

- Bid the Opponent's suit
- It is a "Forcing" bid
- Promises a limit raise or better in "Overcaller's" suit

• Cuebid's purpose:

- Asks the Overcaller about quality of the overcall
 - With minimum, Overcaller rebids suit
 - Any other bid by Overcaller shows opening hand
- o Don't use cuebid if you know you have a Golden game....just bid it

Advancing after a One level Overcall:

Left hand opponent bids 1 ♣ and your partner overcalls 1 ♠. What would you bid with the following hands?


- 1. ♠ A 8 7
 - **v** 10 9
 - ♦ K763
 - ♣ J752

Answer: 2 ♠

- 2. ★ J632
 - **y** 9
 - ♦ KQ87
 - ♣ Q876

Answer: 2 ♣ CUEBID!

- 3. ★ K 10 7 5 3
 - **Y**
 - ♦ AJ82
 - ♣ Q 10 7 3



Advancing after a Two level Overcall.

Left hand opponent bids 1 ♠ and your partner overcalls 2 ♥. What would you bid with the following hands?


- 1. ♠ K 10 7 3
 - **♥** J4
 - ♦ QJ62
 - **♣** 742

Answer: PASS

- 2. ♠ A8
 - **♥** KJ5
 - Q 10 6 2
 - ♣ J542

Answer: 2 ♠ Cuebid!

- 3. ♠ J 3
 - **Y** A 10 7 2
 - ♦ AKJ8
 - ♣ 10 4 2



Advancing after a One NT Overcall

Remember: Overcaller is promising <u>15 - 18 pts</u>

Respond in the same manner as if Opener was bidding 1 NT!

Left hand opponent bids 1 ◆ and <u>your partner overcalls 1 NT</u>. Responder Passes. What would you bid with the following hands?

- 1. ♠ 4
 - **9** 9 7 6 5 3 2
 - ◆ QJ7
 - ♣ 642

Answer: 2 ♦ - "Transfer" to ♥

- 2. ♠ KJ3
 - **Y** Q96
 - ♦ AJ3
 - **♣** 7542

Answer: 3 NT

- 3. ♠ 8753
 - ♥ K962
 - 1083
 - **♣** 75
