Facing a 15-17 1NT rebid, West is worth bidding game. Whether he should do so directly or look for a spade fit depends on system. If you play Acol as I like to do, you would open 14 with 15-17 and 4-4 in the black suits. In this case East cannot hold 4 spades so the above auction is correct. If it is possible for East to hold 4 spades, then West needs to introduce the suit – the simple way being to bid  $2 \pm$  over 1NT. On this deal, despite the combined 25 HCP, East will do well to make 3NT – maybe even making 8 tricks will score well.
