Jump-Shifts in the 21st Century

Some Thoughts on the Modern Ways to Play Them

Jump-Shifts by Opener

- Always strong.
- Show an unbalanced hand.
- Not particularly suited for no trump.
- Although no trump might still be the final contract.

Here's An Example

```
North East South West

1♠ pass 1nt pass

3♥
```

North's hand

- **AKJ42**
- **∀** A Q J 2
- ♦ 5 (20 points)
- **♣** K Q 3

- In this auction, this is what south would expect to see in partner's hand.
- 19-21 points, unbalanced.
- Not suited for no trump.

South Might Have a Problem

- North East South West

 1♠ pass 1nt pass

 3♥
- South's hand
- **♠** Q 3
- ▼ K 5 4
- ♦ 9 7 3 2 (6 points)
- ♣ J 7 6 2

- Pass is not an option.
- With this hand, probably the best option is to try 3♠.
- Partner will know you do not have 3-card support.

Suppose South Has Something Like This?

```
North East South West

1♣ pass 1♦ pass

2♥
```

- South's hand
- **♦** J 9 8 3
- **y** 5 4
- ◆ A J 7 3 2 (6 points)
- **♣** 6 2

- Pass is still not an option.
- You can bid 2♠.
- Partner has 19-21
 points and probably 5
 clubs and 4 hearts.

Suppose North Has a More Balanced Hand

```
North East South West

1♣ pass 1♦ pass

2nt

North's hand

♠ A K 7 3

▼ K J 9 4
```

♦ A 2 (18 points)

♣ K 6 2

- Still an awkward hand to bid.
- With a balanced hand you can bid no trump.
- A jump to two no trump shows a hand too good for 1 no trump and not quite good enough for a 2 no trump opening.
- 18 or 19 points
- Does not deny a 4-card major suit.

Here's an Agreement You Should Have for These Kinds of Hands

```
North East South West

1♣ pass 1♦ pass

2nt pass 3♣ pass

3♥ pass 4♥
```

- **★** 5 2
- **Y** K 8 7 3
- ♦ A J 9 4 (8 points)
- **♣** 8 5 3

- In this bidding sequence, 3 clubs should be check back Stayman.
- In case opener has a 4card major suit.

Here's an Agreement You Should Have for These Kinds of Hands

North	East	South	West
1♣	pass	1 •	pass
2nt	pass	3♣	pass
3♠	pass	4 ♠	

North's hand

- **A** A J 5 2
- **Y** K 8
- ♦ A J 9 4 (18 points)
- **♣** K Q 3

- In this bidding sequence, 3 clubs should be check back Stayman.
- In case opener had a 4 card major.
- North elected to show the strength of his hand before showing the spade fit.

Remember Partner's Jump to Game is Not a Shutout Bid.

```
North East South West

1♣ pass 1♠ pass

4♠
```

- South's hand
- **♦** K 8 5 2
- **v** 8 7 3
- ♦ J 9 4 (6 points)
- ♣ Q 5 3

- Opener's bid shows 19-21 points.
- With this hand, of course, you will pass and play the game.

But if You Have Something Like This, You're Thinking Slam

```
North East South West

1♣ pass 1♠ pass

4♠ pass 5♦
```

- **★** K Q 7 5 2
- **∀** K 7 3
- ♦ A 9 4 (14 points)
- **♣** Q 3

- Opener's bid shows 19-21 points.
- Cue bid your first round control in diamonds to show slam interest.

When Responder Jump-Shifts

- It is weak (most play it weak).
- I'll talk about some other options in a minute.
- If you play it weak, it is really weak.
- 2-4 or 5 points and a six card suit.
- You tell partner your hand is worthless unless you name your suit trump.

The Weak Jump-Shift

```
North East South West

1   pass 2   pass
```

- **★** K10 7 5 4 2
- **7** 3 2
- ♦ 10 9 4 (3 points)
- **♣** 3

- A weak jump shift by responder is 2-4 or 5 points.
- A 6-card or longer suit.
- It is usually a jump to a two level in a major suit after partner opens a minor.

Another Weak Jump-Shift

```
North East South West

1♣ pass 2♥ pass
```

- **4** 2
- ▼ K J 9 7 3 2
- ♦ 10 9 4 (4 points)
- **◆** 5 3 2

- A weak jump shift by responder is 2-4 or 5 points.
- A 6-card or longer suit.
- This one is about a maximum weak jumpshift.

Suppose You Have This Holding?

- North East South West

 1♣ pass 1♥ pass
- South's hand
- **2**
- ♥AJ9732
- ♦ Q J 4 (8 points)
- **♣** 5 3 2

- Just bid 1♥.
- Then if partner shows anything but a really strong hand, you will simply rebid your hearts.
- Too strong for a weak jump-shift.

Would You Make a Weak Jump-Shift With this Hand?

North East South West

1♣ pass

- **4** 2
- ♥ J 10 9 7 5 2
- ♦ 9 7 4 (1 point)
- **◆** 5 3 2

- Probably not a good idea.
- True, your hand is worthless.
- But this is too weak.
- Of course, if partner opened 1nt, you would transfer and drop.

When Partner Opens a Major Suit

North East South West 1♥ pass pass

- **♦**85
- **Y** 2
- ◆ Q 7 4 (5 points)
- ♣ K 10 8 5 3 2

- It is probably best not to make a weak jumpshift.
- You get to the 9 trick level.
- Best to pass and hope the opponents come in.

Many Pairs Play Bergen Raises

North East South West

1♥ pass 3♣

- **★** 8 5
- **Y** K 10 6 2
- ♦ A 5 4 2 (8 points)
- ♣ J 10 8

- 3 shows a hand with
 7-10 points and 4card support.
- Called a constructive raise.

Many Pairs Play Bergen Raises

```
North East South West

1♥ pass 3♦
```

- **★** 8 5
- ▼ K 10 6 2
- ♦ A 5 4 2 (8 points)
- ♣ J 10 8

- 3 shows a hand with 10-12 points and 4card support.
- Called a Limit raise.
- So, of course, Bergen raises takes away the weak jump-shift, over a major-suit opening.

Now for Something Completely Different

```
North East South West

1♥ pass 3♦

South's hand

★ K 5

♥ 6 2 (11 points)

♦ A Q J 5 4 2
```

♣ J 10 8

- This is a convention recommended by Larry Cohen.
- Over 1♥ or 1♠, a jump shift to a minor shows a good six card suit and invitational values.

Many Pairs Play Criss-Cross as Part of the Inverted Minors Convention

- When Partner opens a minor suit, a jump-shift to the other minor shows:
 - 5 cards in the opener's minor.
 - No 4-card major.
 - And invitational values 10 to 12 points.
- That makes a single raise in the opener's minor game forcing and a jump raise preemptive.

Criss-Cross Example 1

```
North East South West

1♣ pass 2♦

South's hand

♠ K 5 3
```

- **♥** 6 2 (11 points)
- ♦ J 5 3
- ♣ A Q J 10 8

- 2♦ is a jump-shift. If you play weak jump-shifts, it would show 2-5 points with a six card diamond suit.
- If you play criss-cross, it shows this hand.

Criss-Cross Example 2

- **★** K 5 3
- ♥ 6 2 (11 points)
- ♦ A Q J 5 3
- ♣ J 10 8

- 3♣ is a jump-shift. If you play weak jumpshifts, it would show 2-5 points with a six card diamond suit.
- If you play criss-cross, it shows this hand.

Criss-Cross Example 3

```
North East South West

1♦ pass 2♦
```

- **★** K 5 3
- ▼ K 2 (14 points)
- ◆ A Q J 5 3
- ♣ J 10 8

- 2 is the inverted minor convention.
- However, with cris-cross there is no doubt.
- Responder has a game forcing hand.

Final Thoughts

- The use of the jump-shift is changing in 21st century bidding.
- I'm not necessarily recommending any of these changes, but you should be aware of them.
- Some of them offer some interesting advantages.
- Talk them over with your partner.
