The heart finesse is tempting, but it's better to go and work to set up the diamond suit. Be careful about how you do this. You need to duck a diamond first before playing the ace and another.

Those club finesses look promising, but you should work on the diamond suit. Yes, you're missing the A/K/10/9, but you will take three tricks in this suit if you find an honor doubleton or third onside.

While you can take the diamond finesse eventually, you might as well see if luck is with you in the club suit. You'll need a lot of luck (2-2 spades and KQx of clubs), but increasing your odds is always good. Play ace of clubs and ruff a club high.

High spade and the s7 over to the dummy's 10. This might be your only entry so if spades were 3-1, you'd need to take your diamond finesse now. With spades 2-2, you can ruff another club and voila! The S2 is your last way over to dummy.

We looked all set until the club lead got ruffed. Now things look bleak. Don't rush to take the heart finesse. While West might have started with Kx, that looks unlikely on the play. Instead, you can endplay West by drawing trump and exiting with the DJ.
