## Weak Twos in Three Suits

- 2a-23+ points, or fewer points with game in your own hand. This is the same as in normal Acol.
- 2 - Weak: 5-10 points, 6 diamonds
- $2 \downarrow$ - Weak: 5-10 points, 6 hearts
- $2 \boldsymbol{A}$ - Weak: $5-10$ points, 6 spades
- Good Quality 6-card suit (at least 2 honours)
- On BBO you self-alert all these bids:

ALERT: WEAK or ALERT: STRONG, ARTIFICIAL

## Responding to a Weak Two

Typically need about $\mathbf{1 6}$ pts to make game (in a major), or fewer points with a good fit.

Bidding a new suit at the 3 level is forcing, showing a 5+ good suit. At the 2 level it is encouraging, but not forcing.
Here $4 \vee$ should be easier to make (and score better) than $5 *$

## If Playing Weak Twos in Three Suits

- Open most 22 point hands with 2* (unless you can bid 2NT)
- Try to respond to one of a suit if you have $5+$ points (partner could have up to 21 points).
