## Bidding Opposite a Passed hand

- Responding to one of a suit in a new suit by responder is absolutely 100\% forcing,
- except if partner has previously passed.

## Rule of 15

In $4^{\text {th }}$ Seat (the other 3 players have passed)

- Add your total points to the number of spades you have.
- With 15 or more, make your normal bid
- Otherwise pass, which will be the final contract.


## Summary

- If responder has passed (showing 11pts max) you can pass responder's new suit, if you are a minimum.
- Can bid a weak two with a good 5 card suit in $3^{\text {rd }}$ seat
- Can Preempt with $12+$ pts in $3^{\text {rd }}$ seat
- Open in $4^{\text {th }}$ seat if you have the spade suit Rule of 15
