
THE ONLY FORCING BID RESPONDER CAN MAKE BASIC GUIDELINES FOR BIDDING



- When looking for a fit, both opener and responder should avoid rebidding their own five-card suit. This is even true when responder has a five-card major suit.
- After the opening bid, most new suit bids show four cards. However, we make an exception for a
 2♥ response to a 1♠ opening bid; responder needs five hearts.
- A new suit by responder is forcing. That means responder does not have to and usually should not jump in a new suit to show a good hand. Later in the auction, responder might have occasion to make up a new suit bid in order to force opener to provide more information.
- Bids of old suits are NOT forcing. Any time you bid a suit mentioned already by either you or your partner, you show your strength. An old suit at the two-level shows a minimum hand; an old suit at the three-level shows a medium hand. Don't bid an old suit below game if you have a maximum hand.
- Notrump bids show strength and are NOT usually forcing. After the opening bid, 1NT by opener or responder shows a minimum hand. 2NT is generally invitational but not forcing.
- When responder bids a major on the one level and then rebids in a new suit, opener's top priority is often to show delayed (three-card) support for responder's major.
