## True-False Slam Bidding Quiz

- Your job is to determine if the following sentences are true or false.
- You are playing Roman Key-Card Blackwood, 1430 version.


## Statement 1

- Holding 5 key cards without the queen of the agreed trump suit, your response to 4 no trump is $5 \vee$.

| Opener's hand | Opener | You | Your hand |
| :---: | :---: | :---: | :---: |
| , AK 3 | 2 | 2 | - 4 |
| - AK 6 | 2 nt | 3 | - Q J 10973 |
| - AJ 95 | 3 | 4 nt | -K53 |
| - A 98 | 5 | 5 nt | - K Q 3 |
|  | 6 | 7nt |  |

## Statement 2

- When partner asks for key cards and you have a void, you can bid as if that void was an ace.
- This is False!


## To Show a Useful Void After 4 No

 Trump- With an even number of key cards, usually 2 , bid 5nt.
- With an odd number of key cards, 1or 3,
- Bid six of the void suit, if it is below the agreed trump suit.
- Bid six of the trump suit if the useful void is above the trump suit.


## Some Examples

Example 2

- Q 1042
- K 1073
-AQ743

Example 3

- Q 1042
- K 1073
*AQ743
- Hearts are trump
- Partner bids 4nt.
- Your response:

5nt.

- Spades are trump
- Partner bids 4nt.
- Your response: 6 *.


## One More Example

Example 4
-

- QJ 73
-KQ4 2
-AQ 743
- Hearts are trump
- Partner bids 4nt.
- Your response: $6 \%$.


## Statement 3

- A cue bid after a trump suit agreement always shows first-round control of the suit bid.
- This is False!


## Control Showing Cue Bids

- Any new suit bid after a trump suit agreement:
- At the 3-level above the trump suit
- At the 4-level below the trump suit

Shows first or second round control.

- First-round control
- Ace
- Void
- Second-round control
- King
- singleton


## Control Showing Cue Bids

- Any new suit bid after a trump suit agreement:
- At the 4-level above the agreed trump suit
- At the 5- level

Shows first round control.

## Statement4

- After a trump-suit agreement, a direct bid of 5 no trump is asking for kings.
- This is False!


## A Direct Bid of 5 No Trump

- Usually means a Grand Slam Force.
- Responders are to bid 7 of the agreed trump suit, if they hold 2 of the top three honors in the trump suit.
- Holding less than two of the top three honors, they are to bid 6 of the agreed trump suit.


## Some Examples

Example 5

- AKJ1042
- K 108
- A 2
- 85

Opener Responder
$\begin{array}{ll}1 & 2 n t \\ 3 & 5 n t \\ 7\end{array}$

Responder's hand

- Q 975
- A 3
. AK Q 10743

- How would you handle this situation?

Partner RHO You *15-18 1 1 1 nt* ?
I will show you some hands. You tell me what you would bid.

## Example 6

Partner RHO You $1 \vee \quad 1 \mathrm{nt}$ ?

Your hand

- KJ4
- 83
-AJ653
- Q 85
- Double!
- You have 10 points.
- You are sitting behind the no trump bidder.
- You know the no trump bidder's partner has no more than 2 or 3 points.


## Example 7

Partner RHO You $1 \vee \quad 1 \mathrm{nt}$ ?

Your hand

- KJ10 853
$\bullet 3$
- J 965
. 105
- 2 !
- Because you did not double, partner knows you have fewer than 10 points.
- And you'll have a good suit.


## Example 8

Partner RHO You 1 1nt ??<br>Your hand<br>- A 3<br>- 10863<br>- J 965<br>- 1095

- 2 リ!
- Don't let them buffalo you.
- 4-card support is worth an extra point.


## Example 9

Partner RHO You $1 \vee \quad 1 \mathrm{nt}$ ?

Your hand

- A J 3
- K 63
- Q 65
- 10953
- Double!
- Yes, you have a fit, but don't pass up the big score.
- $2 \vee$ is for sissies. You'd probably make it,
- But 1nt should be down two or three.


## Example 10

Partner RHO You
$1 \vee \quad 1$ nt ?

Your hand

- 3
- K10 63
-K 10865
+1095
- $3 \vee$ !
- Preemptive.
- Use the law.
- Partner knows you are weak.
- Partner will expect you to have 4 hearts and good distribution.


## Example 11

$\begin{array}{ccc}\text { Partner } & \text { RHO } & \text { You } \\ 1 \vee & 1 \text { nt } & ? ?\end{array}$

Your hand

- AK 953
$\vee 10$
-K J 104
. 953
- Double!
- Don't be sucked into 2 a.
- Go for the kill.
- With 11 points, you might have a game.
- But that is a long way from certain.
- 1 nt is in for a real bad time.


## Example 12

Partner RHO You
$1 \vee \quad 1 \mathrm{nt}$ ?

Your hand

- J5 3
- 105
- QJ 764
- J5 3
- Pass!
- When you don't have anything, pass is best.
- It is probably their hand.
