South Deals
Both Vul


Join me as East for this deal from the NABC Senior Swiss Teams. Our defensive signals: upside-down attitude and count, reverse Smith echo, and give count on partner's lead. (These are all non-standard agreements.)

Standard count would be low from an odd number. Playing upside-down, we put the 04 (high) under dummy's ace.

Declarer calls for a small diamond from dummy. Plan the defense.

This is not a trick question -- we keep our mitts off that jack! Playing Smith echo, we show attitude toward partner's lead by our play in diamonds.

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There is one scenario where we can do the nasty to declarer - and this is it! Follow (smoothly) with the $\diamond 3$. This is an encouraging signal -- reverse Smith echo is compatible with upside-down attitude signals. Declarer fatally guesses to play the $\diamond \mathrm{K}$, won by partner's ace. Partner duly leads another heart, $\uparrow 2, \diamond \mathrm{~J}, \diamond \mathrm{Q}$, leaving this heart situation:

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Declarer cannot make the contract without another diamond trick. We get in with the $\diamond \mathrm{J}$ and push a heart through. We take three hearts, two diamonds and a spade: two down.

In all the years I have been playing Smith echo, this is one of the few times I have seen it applied successfully.
