## First-time NABC win for Senior Swiss victors

After losing their first two matches in the Truscott/U.S. Playing Card Senior Swiss, the team captained by Larry Harding switched gears, accelerating to win 13 of the remaining 14 matches to take the event with 123.14 victory points.

Harding, of Hampstead NC, played with John Herriot, Los Angeles CA, Bob Heller, Knoxville TN and Robert Fendrick, Marietta GA.

About 6 victory points off the winning pace was the squad led by Martin Scheinberg, Riviera Beach FL. Scheinberg's teammates were Bill Eisenberg, Perris CA; Howard Perlman, Franklin MI;s Jeffrey Starr, Las Vegas NV, and Paul Trent and Sandra Trent, Asheville NC.

Said Heller, who became

the ACBL's newest Grand Life Master with the win, "We avoided disasters. We played steady bridge." The victory is the first NABC title for all

## Elaine's scary adventure

On a Friday afternoon in April of this year, at a hotel in Cranbrook BC, Martin Ware heard the four sweetest words he could ever have imagined. "We have a pulse."

It's part of a story with nightmarish beginning, a harrowing middle – and the happiest of endings.

Here's what happened.

Elaine Ware, Martin's wife, was playing in a sectional tournament in Cranbrook run by Tournament Director Steve Bates. Martin, also a TD, was assisting.

During the afternoon game, Elaine and her partner, Judy Harris, pulled their hands out of a board and started the auction. Harris, of Salmon Arm BC, bid 1♣. After a pass by Elaine's RHO, she bid 3♣. Elaine's left-hand opponent doubled. That was followed by a pass and 3♠ by the doubler's partner.

Elaine was about to make a call when her LHO asked Harris what Elaine's 3♣ bid meant.

Elaine looked at her LHO – and fell out of her chair onto the floor.

Luckily for her, Dr. Michael Shuster, a physician, was playing at the tournament. He immediately started CPR on Elaine and told bystanders to call 911.

It took 12 minutes for the emergency medical technicians to show up. While he waited, Shuster, an emergency room physician from Banff, continued the CPR.

"He kept blood flowing to my head from the beginning," Elaine says.

The EMTs arrived with an external defibrillator and sent electric shocks through her once, twice and a third time.

Nothing.

Martin recalls, "I was thinking, 'God, is this it?'"

The EMTs didn't quit, shocking Elaine a fourth time.

Martin recalls, "It was quite a relief when I heard the words 'We have a pulse.'"

Elaine, 72, was taken to a local hospital and eventually flown from Cranbrook to Kelowna, where tests showed that her heart problem was electrical and not caused by blockage. She was in Kelowna for 13 days before going to Victoria BC, which has world-class heart specialists.

She now sports a small scar near her collarbone on the left side, where an ICD – implantable cardioverter defibrillator – was

## Form holds (mostly) in Spingold KO

All of the top seeds in the Spingold Knockout Teams prevailed – most of them easily – in the round of 64, but one big name is out of the event.

The team captained by Bob Hamman, seeded No. 18, went down to the 47 seed, captained by Michael Schreiber, 152-134. Schreiber (Jim Munday, Bob Etter, Alex Kolesnik) jumped out to a 42-IMP lead in the first quarter against Hamman (Justin Lall, Bob and Shane Blanchard, Joel Wooldridge, John Hurd) and advanced to the round of 32, where they will face the Jim Mahaffey squad.

Only one of the top seeds had any difficulty advancing to today's play. That was the No. 10 seed, captained by Sjoert Brink, one of four members of the 2011 Bermuda Bowl champions from the Netherlands on the team with Americans Daniel Zagorin and Kevin Bathurst. Against the No. 55 seed, led by New Yorker Allen Kahn, Brink eked out a 128-125 win. Brink's other teammates are Bas Drijver, Louk Verhees and Rico van Prooijen.

The top-seeded Monaco (Pierre Zimmermann) team blasted No. 64 Blair Seidler 223-76; No. 2 Nick Nickell cruised past Stephen Drodge 185-68 and No. 3 John Diamond beat Geoff Hopcraft 216-58.

In Mini-Spingold I (0-5000), the field of 24 teams was reduced to 16 with some three-way matches and is set to conclude on Saturday.

The Mini-Spingold II (0-1500) is now in the round of eight and will crown a champion on Friday.

## Wagar - and now there are four

The top three seeds advanced to the semifinal round of the Wagar Women's Knockouts.

The No. 1 Geeske Joel squad lapped the No. 8 Jean Barry team 163-86.

Two seed Valerie Westheimer overcame a 19-point deficit in the first quarter to beat the Lynne Schaeffer squad 129 to 114.

After a tight first half, Barbara Sonsini's team blew things open with a 45-2 third quarter, and held off a fourth-quarter charge by the Rozanne Pollack squad to take the match 122-107.

The fifth seed JoAnn Sprung squad held off the Phyllis Fireman team 119-93.

Semifinal action today pits Joel versus Sprung and Westheimer versus Sonsini.

## Californians ahead in Wernher Open

Two California players have the lead with two sessions left to play in the Wernher Open Pairs. They are Li-Chung Chen of Cupertino and Ari Greenberg of San Francisco. Their carryover score of 276.96 gives them a lead of 28.59 matchpoints over Kyoko Shimamura of Tokyo and Russell Samuel of Coram NY.

Two Toronto pairs – Robert Lebi-David Lindop and Nader Hanna-Doug Baxter – were close behind in third and fourth places, respectively.

JUST FOR NEW PLAYERS

### What is our carding?

Defense is hard. Think about it: The declaring side usually has more points, they've picked a strain we wouldn't choose and the declarer gets to tell his partner what to play. Wouldn't you be delighted sometimes if you could tell partner what to play?

Well, you have one huge advantage that shouldn't be squandered. The opening lead is unique in bridge. It's the only time you get to lead without having won a trick. Which card you lead and what your partner plays to the trick are part of the carding agreements that allow you to defend effectively.

You and your partner should get together and look at the chart on the back of the convention card. See the bold lettering? That indicates the most popular leads given those holdings. If you aren't sure what to lead, learning what is considered standard is the place to start. Notice that the ace from A-K-x is not in bold; if you usually lead the ace from A-K-x, circle or underline the ace to show your agreement.

You are certainly allowed to vary from standard. Maybe you play coded 10s and 9s. The opponents are entitled to know your leading and carding agreements. If you haven't discussed this essential part of the defense with your partner, you should.

There is one common agreement I hope you will not use: A lot of players want partner to lead the highest card in the suit they've bid. So if I have ♥Q 4 2 and partner has bid hearts, I'm supposed to lead the queen. Especially when leading against a notrump contract, this is a very bad idea. Picture this layout of the heart suit:

♥ Q 4 2

♥ 3

♥ A 10 9 8 6 5

♥ K J 7

Partner has bid her six-card suit, but the opponents have ended up in notrump anyway. You dutifully lead the ♥Q and declarer gets an undeserved second heart trick. If you lead low, partner knows you have more than two hearts (you'd lead high-low with a doubleton). Partner

will rise with the ace, lead back the 10, and your queen will capture declarer's jack. Mission accomplished. Leading high should show a doubleton or the top of a sequence.

If you have raised with no card higher than the 9, some partnerships think it's okay to lead high. Partner already knows you have more than two-card support, and the lead of a 9 denies an honor. If you haven't raised, it's still right to lead low to give partner count. And don't forget that declarer doesn't know your three cards don't include an honor. He may make an error in the play if you lead low. That is unlikely to happen if you lead high.

Another common carding agreement that I find ineffective is to say, "Partner, my first discard, even if it is a deuce, is the suit I want you to lead." This is *not* a standard carding policy, mainly because it doesn't work very well and is not popular with the majority of experienced players. Consider this hand:

♠K Q J   ♥4 3 2   ♦6 5 4   ♣J 10 4 2.

Declarer wins the opening club lead and starts to run her six-card diamond suit. Do you really want to discard a spade to tell your partner what to play? Surely it would be less painful to throw the ♥2 and then the ♥3. I hate voiding myself in a suit that hasn't been played even once, but black-suit discards seem hateful with this hand.

Perhaps you play odd-even or Lavinthal discards. Please remember that you may use a coded discard only on the first time you fail to follow suit. After that, only standard discards are legal. What's standard? High-low to encourage and low-high to discourage. The one variation allowed is upside-down: low-high for yes and high-low for no. Upside-down count and attitude are popular, but they are no substitute for careful play. Don't forget, a signal not only has to be sent, it has to be received.



Typically, we give attitude if partner leads a suit. High-low says either I like it or I have help. Low-high warns partner you aren't interested or don't have help. When declarer leads a suit and we don't have to play an honor or try to win the trick, we give count. High-low shows an even number, low-high an odd number. Notice that following suit is different from discarding. As always, some players make an exception that they find useful: a gratuitous high-low in trump promises an odd number. This can be handy to help partner count the hand and also to let her know that you have another for ruffing purposes.

How about lead directing? When do we do that? Well, one way is with discards. The other common situation arises when you give partner a ruff and want to tell her how to get back to your hand. What if you had:

♠A K 9 7 2   ♥6   ♦4 3 2   ♣A 7 5 4?

Against a heart contract, you lead the top spades and give partner a ruff. The card you lead for the ruffing trick tells partner what to lead back. In this case, you lead the 2 to tell partner that a club is the way back to your hand.

### Thinking bridge

**Opening lead:** ♥Q.

**Bidding commentary:** Think "four-level preempt" when looking at an eight-card suit with less than opening-bid values. After the 4♥ opening, South bids what he thinks he can make. Four-level preempts do that to you.

**Play commentary:** At trick one, South

must play the ♥K under the ace! Why? When the ♥Q is led, East *knows* South has the king but doesn't know who has the jack. From South's point of view, the king and jack are equals once the queen is led. In order to protect himself, South must play the card he is known to hold, the king. If the king is played at trick one, West may be torn between leading a second heart or trying to cash the ♦A. If South plays the ♥J at trick one, it's a no-brainer. East can safely lead a heart for West to ruff as East knows South still has the ♥K.

Declarer and the defenders have to be alert to play cards they are known to hold if it cannot cost a trick. When the card you are known to hold (♥K) has an equal (♥J) it is mandatory to unload the one you are known to hold.

Why hang on to a card the opponents know you have when you can play it and keep a card the opponents don't know you have? The longer you hold "known" cards that can safely be played, the easier you make life for your opponents.

Think of known cards that have equals as hot potatoes! Get rid of them!

# Combining your chances

This deal comes from Bracket III of the Saturday-Sunday Bracketed Knockouts.

The duplicated values in spades means the slam may be in jeopardy. How can declarer combine his chances so that he can take 12 tricks even when suits don't break well?

The beginner may see that if diamonds are 3-3, there will be a pitch for the losing club and declarer will then take the club finesse for 13 tricks.

When diamonds don't break, declarer must look for more chances. Declarer can draw trumps and play two rounds of spades to eliminate that suit as a safe exit. Next he plays the diamonds. When declarer sees that West started with four diamonds, declarer can play the fourth round of diamonds and discard the ♣6 out of his hand. West will win the diamond, but he is then forced to lead away from the ♣K to make his contract. In the bracketed KO, both declarers found this line to push the board. If either declarer failed, it would have cost the match.

What if diamonds break 4-2 the other way with East having four? Now, the loser-on-loser play won't work. Is there anything else besides the club finesse? Actually, there is. There is a safety play.

After ruffing out the fourth diamond, South cashes the ♠A first. Then South goes to dummy in trump and leads toward the ♣Q. Sometimes the ♣Q loses, but declarer still has 12 tricks. The layout might be:

West will win the club but will have to concede a ruff and discard and the contract. With three tricks remaining and the lead in the dummy, the final position would be:

The player on my team who found the loser-on-loser play was Kevin Dwyer. We went on to win the event.

# Electronic Device Policy

The electronic device policy is revised as follows:

- For all NABC+ rated events at NABCs: Electronic devices, including but not limited to, phones, cameras, PDAs, and others capable of sending or receiving electronic communication are excluded from the playing areas during any session of play. This does not apply to health-related equipment.
- For all events at an NABC other than a NABC+ rated event: Except for health-related equipment, or by permission of the Director-in-Charge of the tournament, cell phones, audible pagers or similar equipment may not be operated or operable in any manner in the playing area during a session of play. Any such equipment must not be visible during the session. Sponsoring organizations of other ACBL-sanctioned events are encouraged to adopt a similar policy.
- These restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above apply to all pairs, team members, captains, coaches, play recorders (except those designated by ACBL) and kibitzers and are in force throughout any actual playing session or segment of play.
- A violation of any of the restrictions in numbers 1 and 2 above will result in a disciplinary penalty of one full board (12 IMPs at that form of scoring) for the first offense. A second offense will result in disqualification from the event for the pair/team. Kibitzers violating this policy will be removed from the playing area for the remainder of the session.

# Slow Play

Slow play, as opposed to careful or thoughtful play, is discourteous to your opponents -- and to all other competitors as well. Players and pairs who take more than their allotted time are subject to penalty.

In general, pairs who are rarely late will be warned while pairs who are habitually tardy and/or pay no attention to time limits will be penalized.

implanted. If her heart rhythm gets off, the ICD will make it right. If her heart starts fibrillating – fluttering or beating irregularly – the ICD can shock it back to normal. So far, she says, it hasn’t happened.

Elaine can barely remember the afternoon session, but she does remember waking up on a gurney in a helicopter on her way to Kelowna.

She says there were no warning signs before she fainted. In fact, she says, she had recorded 7000 steps on her pedometer the day of the episode. She is aware that if she had been somewhere else when she fainted, she probably would not be alive.

Shuster, the physician who worked on her at the tournament, told her later that he almost never plays bridge because of his busy schedule – and he said he had never treated a person in cardiac arrest outside of a hospital.

Shuster wrote to Elaine about a month after the episode to congratulate her on a quick recovery. “I represented Heart and Stroke Canada on an international committee on resuscitation for over a decade,” he wrote, “so I am quite familiar with the statistics on survival from cardiac arrest. You really are a success story.”

Elaine says that thanks to Shuster’s quick action, she suffered no memory loss or other brain problems. Shuster told her in the letter that it appears “your brain cells are intact and firing.”

Fully recovered and playing bridge on her regular schedule – including sessions at the Summer NABC – Elaine feels blessed.

“I like to say,” she says, “that learning to play bridge saved my life.”

## Convention card reminder

Each player is required to have a convention card filled out legibly and on the table throughout a session. Both cards of a partnership must be identical and include the first and last names of each member of the partnership.

If a director determines that neither player has a substantially completed card, the partnership may play only the Standard American Yellow Card and may use only standard carding. This restriction may be lifted only at the beginning of a subsequent round after convention cards have been properly prepared and approved by the director. Further, the partnership will receive a 1/6-board matchpoint penalty for each board played, commencing with the next round and continuing until the restriction is lifted. In IMP team games, penalties shall be at the discretion of the director.

If the director determines the partnership has at least one substantially completed convention card but has not fully complied with ACBL regulations, the director may give warnings or assign such penalties as he deems to be appropriate under the circumstances.

The objective of these warnings and penalties is the encouragement of full compliance with ACBL regulations.

Bid Box Alerts and Announcements

When using bid boxes, the ACBL requires that players tap the Alert strip and say “Alert” at the same time.

When making an Announcement, use the Announcement word (such as “transfer”) and tap the Alert strip at the same time.

A player who Alerts or Announces a bid must make sure his opponents are aware that an Alert or Announcement has been made.
